Prepare for Emergencies Now: Preparing Makes Sense

The likelihood that you and your family will survive a house fire depends as much on having a working smoke detector and an exit strategy, as your dependence on a well-trained fire department.

The same is true for surviving a natural disaster or other emergency. We must have the tools and plans in place to make it on our own, at least for a period of time, no matter where we are when disaster strikes. Just like having a working smoke detector, preparing for the unexpected makes sense.

Get a Kit of Emergency Supplies
Be prepared to use what you have on hand to make it on your own for at least three days. Think first about fresh water, food, and clean air.

You may need a gallon of water per person, three day



supply of non-perishable foods, warm clothes, duct tape, heavyweight garbage bags, plastic sheeting, flashlight, and first aid kit.

Make a Plan for what you will do in an emergency

Develop a family communication plan. Consider a plan where each family member calls, or emails, the same friend or relative in the event of an emergency. Create a plan to shelter in place. Create a plan to get away. Know emergency plans at school and work.

Be informed about what might happen

Begin a process of learning about the differences between natural or manmade emergencies and biological, chemical, explosive, nuclear and radiological disasters. By beginning a process of learning, about these specific threats, you are preparing yourself to react in an emergency.

Get Involved in preparing your community

Start a neighborhood watch program in your neighborhood. Sign up for nixle.com, to receive community news information from the Alsip Police Department.

Today, 9-1-1 Can't Find You

Over 80% of calls made to 9-1-1 come from mobile phones. When you dial 9-1-1 from a mobile phone, the 9-1-1 call takers have very little information to help you – only your phone number and a very general sense of your location.

This is a serious problem in an emergency when seconds count, particularly if you or your loved ones have medical conditions, or are unable to safely speak.

Smart911 Saves Time and Saves Lives

With Smart911, you can provide 9-1-1 call takers and first responders critical information you want them to know in any kind of emergency.

When you call 9-1-1, your Smart911 Safety Profile displays on the 9-1-1 screen and the 9-1-1 call



takers can view your addresses, medical information, home information, description of pets and vehicles, and emergency contacts. You can provide as much or as little information as you like.

Smart911 is a national service meaning your Smart911 Safety Profile travels with you and is visible to any participating 9-1-1 center nationwide.

With Alerts powered by Smart911, you can sign up for notifications from your community to keep you informed of weather, traffic, and other emergencies. Hear immediately about life-saving actions you must take to keep yourself and your family safe.
